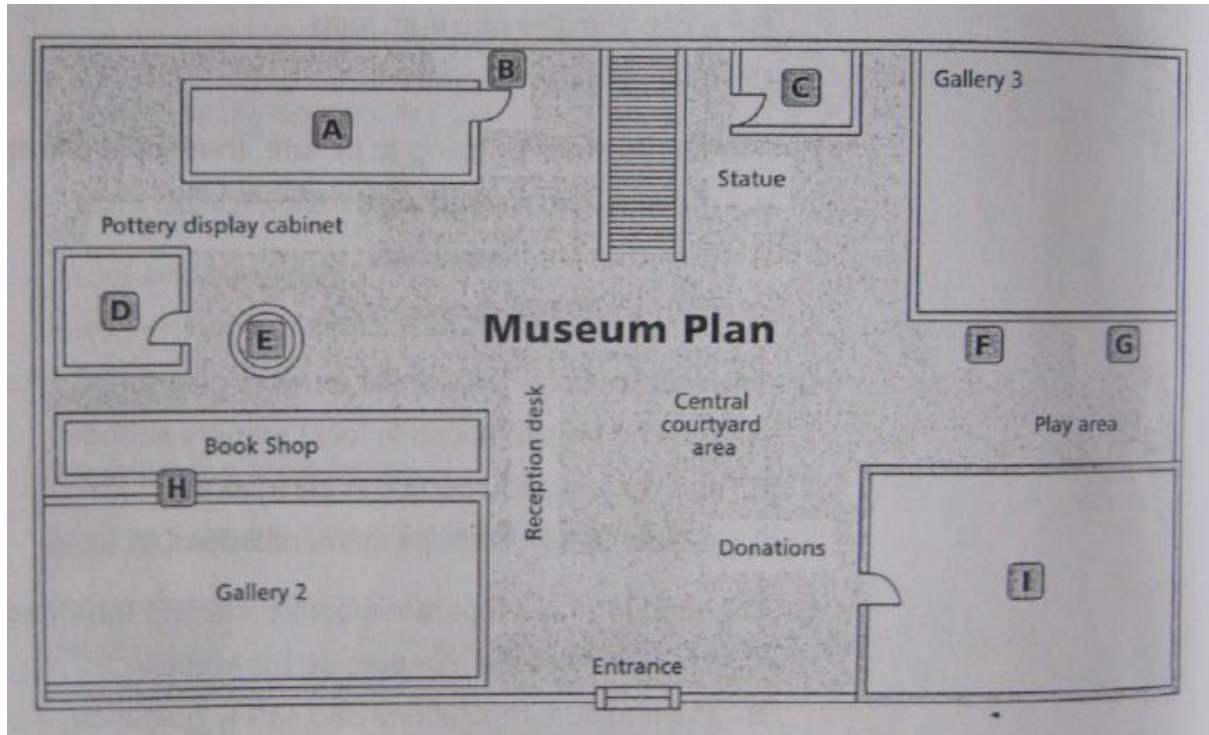

Centre is spelled ending in 're' in British English. In the US, it is spelled 'center' ending in 'er'. Both are correct and a matter of preference.

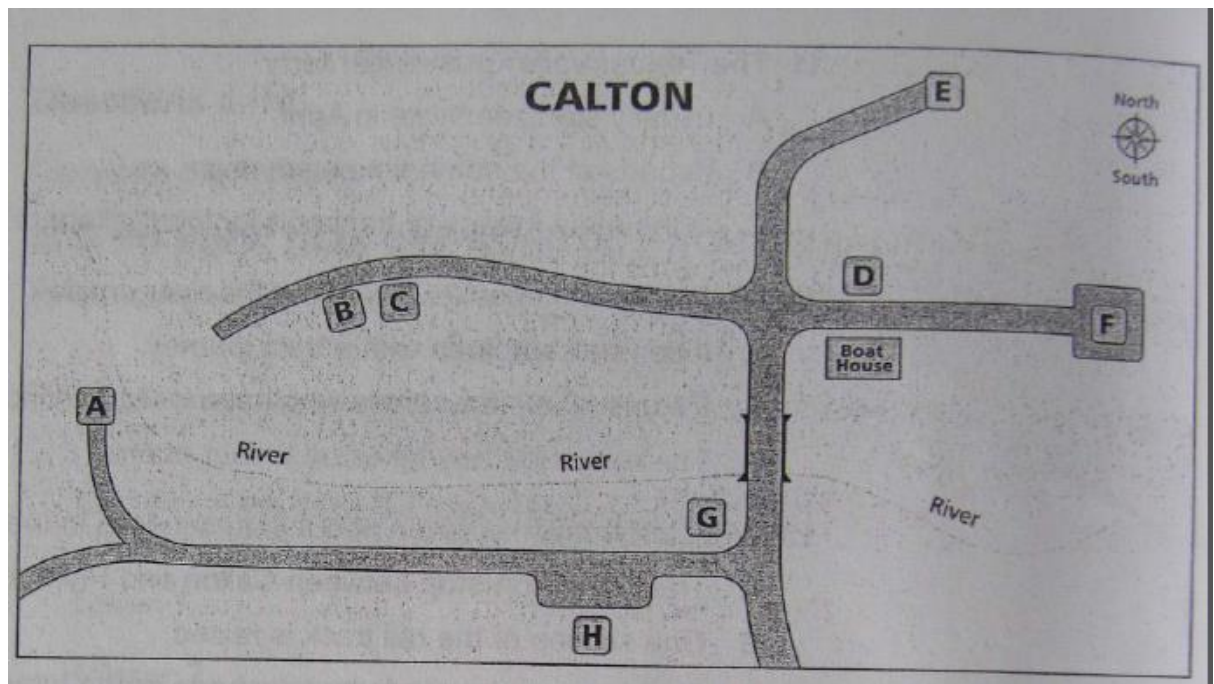

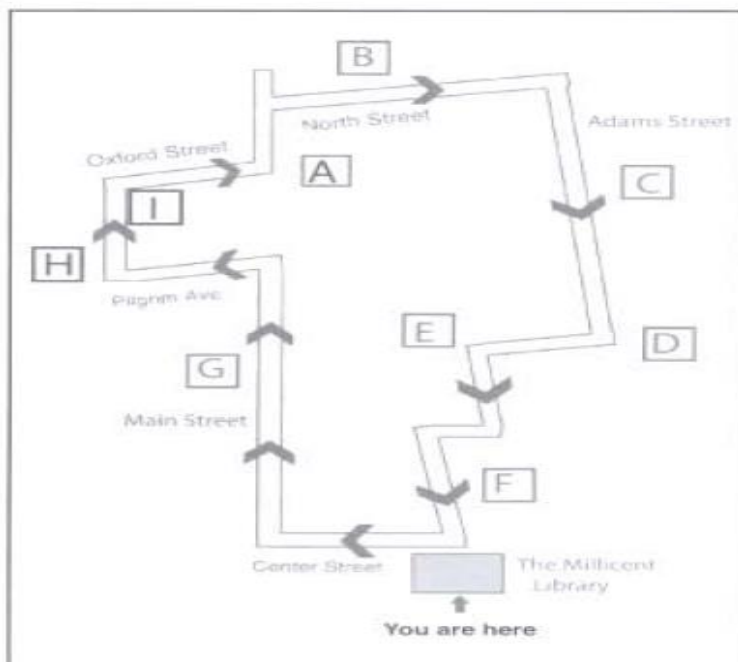
