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
# Major topics and needed language in part 2

- Rooms in buildings (kitchen, bathroom, etc.)
- Places in the city (street, roundabout)
- Places on a map (bus stop, car park, museum)
- directions
- Moving verbs (stop, finish, start)

# Listening like a pro general guideline for part 2

- You may not be able to follow all the details and take note of them because one person is just too fast.
- Guessing is probably the best replacement.
- For guessing you need to know what you should be looking for.
- Reading the questions and guessing the answers might help me listen more attentively.
- Guessing can create an additional aim for the topic.
- Always listen very carefully, but super carefully when you hear the keywords from the question.

### Doing maps




#### The stages in doing maps

- Follow the structure carefully.
- Read all the letters on the map before it starts.
- Get yourself oriented to the missing places (the letters).
- Make sure you know your left and right.
- Find your initial first place, the entrance probably.
